**May 14, 2009**

Mayor Botts called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

**PRESENT:** Mayor Botts, Councilmembers Hanson, Bowie, Boston, Olness and Mulvihill.

**ABSENT:** None

Staff present: Seth Boettcher, Public Works Director; Steve Pilcher, Community Development Director; Aaron Nix, Natural Resources/Parks Director and Brenda L. Martinez, City Clerk.

**Capital Facilities Plan**

Community Development Director provided a detailed overview of the proposed Capital Facilities Plan. He also explained that the intent is to hold on public hearing on the proposed plan at either the June 4 or June 18 regular Council meeting. He further noted the Planning Commission conducted a public hearing on May 12 and no public comments were heard and the Commission has now forwarded the plan onto Council.

In addition, Public Works Director Boettcher added the first plan did not contain enough public work items and therefore needed to be revised in order to be consistent with all city documents coming forward for adoption.

- Parks, Recreation and Open Space

- Utilities

Following discussion the Mayor announced another workstudy will be scheduled in two weeks to revisit the utility portion of the plan.

## **Park Rules**

Natural Resources/Parks Director Nix presented Council with the draft park rules he and the Public Safety Committee have been putting together. He reported recently he held a meeting with those residents on 312<sup>th</sup> to gather feedback as the City starts developing the park and that feedback is what spurred the revision of the rules.

Areas Director Nix highlighted were: 9.86.030 Motor vehicle restrictions, 9.86.040 Liquor, 9.86.050 Animals, 9.86.060 Camping, 9.86.090 Harassing wildlife, 9.86.130 Firearms and explosives, 9.86.140 Fires, 9.86.160 Amplified music, 9.86.170 Littering, 9.86.180 Smoking in City Parks, and lastly 9.86.220 Violations.


Director Nix requested and received direction from Council to schedule a public information meeting on the proposed park rules to give citizen's a chance to participate in the development of the new rules.
