CALL TO ORDER, FLAG SALUTE:

Mayor Olness called the regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and lead us all in the Flag Salute.

NEW BUSINESS:

Resolution No. 12-788, supporting county wide Planning Policies imposing limitations on construction of urban public schools on rural lands

Councilmember Deady reported this was one of the items that were on her list of talking to people when she ran for office. She is passionate about keeping schools within the Master Planned Developments and not in the rural area.

Councilmember Goodwin commented one of the things Council is striving that we are not doing this is a rush and apologized for bringing this forth at this time, but the schedule King County is undertaking we need to act tonight and again apologized for the lateness of this item.

Municipal Court -

Community Development -

Community Development Director Pilcher reported on the changes to the Planning Commission Rules of Procedures to add a City council liaison and provide for an alternate. He noted this was approved by the Planning Commission at their last meeting.

Mayor Olness reported she attend the 4Culture workshop on February 23; attended the graduation of Honored Officer Ross from the Police Academy; thanked Black Diamond Police Department for assisting Kent with the funeral proceedings today for Trooper Tony Radulescu who was shot and killed while making a traffic stop in Gorst, WA; Historical Society lease agreement will be on the March 15th agenda; Rachel's Challenge event at the Enumclaw Stadium; March 8 is the interview for Council candidate followed by a Town Hall meeting and the one agenda item that was postponed form tonight's meeting; Suburban Cities Association request support of their resolution regarding the Governor's reclassification of medicinal cannabis.

A motion was made by Councilmember May and seconded by Councilmember Goodwin to support Suburban Cities Association resolution regarding the Governor's reclassification of medicinal cannabis.

Discussion ensued.
